

From the web:

- (1) Avington: St Mary's is an unrestored red-bricked Georgian church built between 1768-71.
- (2) Newnham: St. Nicholas' was founded about 1130. There are five bells. The two oldest date from 1602 and 1662 and three late Victorian bells were installed in 2010, when the bell dating from about 1500 was stood down after many centuries of ringing out over the landscape.


