

Ringers of Sussex are invited to mark the Tercentenary of the burial of Fabian Stedman. Fabian Stedman is probably the most famous ringer and he had an enormous influence on the development of change ringing by publishing the first books on the subject. He was buried on 16th November 1713.

News from Lindfield



The Bells of Lindfield have had to fall silent for a while. This is due to the commencement of the project to refurbish and rebuild All Saints Church, which has begun with work on the roof and re-shingling the spire. Unfortunately, this has resulted in a scaffolding pole obstructing the swing of the 6 bell and the removal of two of the wheels to allow a girder to pass right through the tower to brace the scaffolding.

The original date of completion of this phase of the project should have been early December but, as the scaffolding was completed two weeks later than planned and extra work beyond that allowed for may come to light, it is not possible to say when we can resume ringing.



We were given a tour of the micro-brewery together with a talk on the process of brewing - then on to the drinking!!




