### Back in Eastbourne after 113 Years!!!

I received an email at the beginning of February from some Canadian Visitors to Brighton telling me that they had a letter and a historic document that a friend wanted them to bring to All Saints' Eastbourne.

The items arrived about a week later in the post in the post.

The historic document [attached] is a framed Peal Record Card celebrating the first peal at All Saints rung on 2 February 1901.

Apparently, it ended up in a second-hand store in Canada. A lady called Betty Limley purchased the card and treasured it for years before deciding to send it home to Eastbourne.

#### News from the SCACR library.

The Open Morning attracted 15 people interested in Alan Seymour's WW1 Sussex Roll of Honour and his research.

The Horsham and Warnham ringers discussed the confusion over the Warnham ringers, who doubled as Horsham ringers, pre- and post- WW1, as Horsham tower was unaffiliated to the Association from c1909 'til c1926.

Alan Baldock brought along his personal Annual Reports for 1914-18 and revealed the discovery of more names. The peal pages are missing from some of the Library copies of the annual reports, so this was important!

The other popular topic was about when ladies started to ring, so Rosemary Cox was able to promote The Ladies' Guild and Margaret Oram looked up a peal in the History of the Ladies' Guild that she'd rung in 1966.

The buzz of conversation increased considerably before we broke for Judy's homemade soup and a ploughman's lunch.

The Library now holds DVDs of The Bell News 1881-1915, The Ringing World 1911-1970 and Annual Reports from 1885 to date, should you wish to discover more about your home tower and its ringers.

#### St. George's Day.

Dear Secretaries, I wrote just before Christmas to again request your kind help in encouraging your towers to join in and ring out on April 23<sup>rd.</sup> We are now in our fourth year and how well so many of you have contributed to creating a growing and successful campaign for St. George's Day. The point of this letter to you is to spur you on and to help support and encourage even more ringers to take part.

As I write Burns Night is being celebrated and so it should. But on April 23<sup>rd</sup> England has a double act for it not only is St. George's Day but Shakespeare's Day and how proud we should all be of such an inheritance. It is a sad reflection on our times that a BBC Cricket correspondent when asked recently by his Australian counterpart 'How do the English celebrate their national day'?' he meekly replied, for all the world to hear as it was going live, that nothing much happened and that, as a nation, we really didn't do anything in particular. So this is the key to why Ringing for England was formed. Such is the growing interest by the general public that a PR company has most generously come forward to help broadcast the efforts made by all bell ringers to a far wider audience and engage with people of note to help spread the word. And part of this exercise is to engage and inform people in the media (eg: cricket correspondents!) that most certainly something is very definitely happening. In turn this has a knock on benefit of reminding the public how fortunate they are to have in their midst so many volunteer bell ringers who form an integral part of our communities, which, again in turn, will hopefully encourage new ringers to come forward. The more towers that ring out the more the public will hear and the greater the campaign will become and then as night follows day we will have a truly nationwide event. This is such a worthwhile cause with a hugely untapped groundswell of public support which will be my role to play in and inform. I will keep you all informed of progress and in return, in order to help me help you, I would very much appreciate it if I was kept up to date with what the towers hope to do on the day. Last year more regional radio stations and regional newspapers covered the occasion than before. I am hoping with the PR company on board we can now inform a far wider nationwide audience and gain their support and goodwill.

The business meeting followed the usual format with Master Christine Baldock in the chair. It was good to have a number of new ringers to be elected to the association. Some were present to be awarded their membership certificates.

At the election of divisional officers the position of ringing Master and Deputy Ringing master were not filled. Initially the current secretary Marion Hollands stated she was not willing to stand and no other proposals were received. However later, Marion did agree to stand on the basis that the secretary duties she is required to undertake would mirror those currently outlined in the Association rules and that she would not be required to complete additional other duties as secretary that may be requested should the 'Vision Proposal' go ahead.

The role of both publicity officer and education officer were also unfilled.

If any Eastern Division member feels they would like to fill any of these vacant rolls or just assist generally as a committee member please do come forward.

The Master gave the meeting an update on the current position with the 'Vision Project' It was suggested that members might like to volunteer at the ADM to fill places on the proposed new county wide teams. However after a proposal from the floor was carried that this action was not appropriate as the ringing membership had not yet approved the 'Vision' changes no volunteers were called for.

In the absence of a Publicity Officer the 'Look To' newsletter will now be published quarterly rather than six times a year as currently the case.
