Scratchings from the Secretary – *Jack Burton*

Graham Hills, our previous District Ringing Master, became the new Association Ringing Master, being the single nominee at the elections at the AGM in May. The AGM was held at Hastings, which meant some long distance travelling for many of us in the Western District. Even so, we were very well represented in what was an otherwise poor turnout for an Association AGM. The Western District, as with all the other three districts, does not have a ringing master and therefore the conduction of practices etc is as agreed in February at the ADM. It is working well to date.

The idea of having Saturday morning gatherings does seem to be very popular. We had good turnouts at both Pulborough in April, and again in June at Milland. Subject to the agreement of the District Committee, these morning meetings will continue and may well increase in number. Please let the Secretary or any other member of the District Committee have your views on this and any other points in the programme you may wish to comment on.

The third Friday 8 bell Advanced Practice has now moved to Westbourne from Felpham and to date numbers attending have increased. The other regular practices are also thriving. It is good to see Christine Butterfield back after her illness and her classes going from strength to strength. If you wish to join one of her meetings, please contact her direct as her practices are geared to the requirements of the pupils. Helpers are also made very welcome, but again please contact her first.

The annual 'Walk and Ring', organised largely by Christine, this year started at Pulborough and finished at Wisborough Green. We had splendid weather and a reasonable turnout. In August we have an evening ring at Heene. This is another recently introduced event which makes use of the light evenings in the summer and is something different. Again we will see how popular they are as to whether we repeat them in the programme. Do keep the front page of Sally Forth to hand for coming events and do please attend them if you can. You will be made most welcome, and they cater for all levels of expertise unless the event is specifically named as a Surprise or Advanced practice. Watch out for the extra things which appear from time to time like the Raising and Lowering training we had at Shipley in June. There will be more.

On the pure Secretarial side, things are very much quieter than in previous years. The new rule whereby new members do not have to be elected is now working and once the Secretary has received the completed Proposal Form, the nominee is a member. A membership certificate will follow usually by the hand-of-ringer mail.

On the newsletter front, the alternating full and partial editions of Sally Forth will continue into the foreseeable future. The District Committee expressed an idea to list briefly the ringing events in other districts in each newsletter. This will require agreement of all districts and the Ringing Master was persuaded to investigate.

The Finance Committee has met on a couple of occasions to first agree a draft Financial Policy statement produced by the new Treasurer, Sue Gadd, and then to prepare it for its adoption, which took place at the General Meeting last May. This is now a working document and is on the web site for reference.

One last item for your consideration; it is time for nominations of candidates for the Michael Palmer award. Please let a member of the Committee have your proposal, with a simple statement about the candidate, by the beginning of November this year.

A Great Achievement by Sussex Young Ringers

Well done to the Sussex Young Ringers who tied in 2nd place in the Call Changes category of the Ringing World National Youth Contest, which was held in Oxford on 11th July. After Bedfordshire in first place with an A*, along with the Derbyshire YR, they achieved a Grade A, beating 13 other teams.

Bell ropes! – Geoff Rix, Petworth

I recently replaced two of our top ends with pre-stretched polyester. Very good I thought, so time to do two more ropes.

However, a different batch of polyester and guess what, very slight stretch under load but one does notice it with nearly an inch of stretch at the sally.

So I thought let's give this new fibre, Dyneema, a go. (Dyneema is an Ultra High Molecular weight Polyethylene fibre developed by DSM in the Netherlands a little over 20 years ago.)

No stretch at all, lighter than polyester, stronger and like polyester, no water absorbance. What's more, it's a similar colour to hemp and splices much easier than polyester.

So in my book, forget polyester and go for Dyneema. Tower Essentials supplied me, they call it Superlative, but I guess a good yacht chandler would also supply.

Happy splicing!

Aldwick: Ringing for Anniversaries and Other Events – Alan Martin

Over the last few years there have been quite a few occasions demanding "special ringing". At Aldwick we rang for the London Olympics, HM The Queen's Diamond Jubilee, the Centenary of the start of World War I and this year, so far, we have rung for St George's Day, VE Day and, "three for the price of one" – Magna Carta, Battle of Waterloo and Sussex Day.

Obviously, members of the public will understand the significance of ringing on Sundays and for occasions such as weddings but we have felt for some time that, although "special ringing" is all well and good, do passers-by realise what is actually being celebrated? We therefore decided, with our Vicar's approval, to produce a board for display in the churchyard, facing the road on appropriate days. This board has permanent wording at the top reading: "Our bells will be rung today at" with sufficient space below to insert the commencement time and to describe what the "special ringing" is for.

The accompanying two photographs show our board as prepared for the WWI centenary and Magna Carta/Battle of Waterloo/Sussex Day.





Perhaps some other towers already do something similar and maybe more should consider doing so to keep local residents better informed about what, to some people, might otherwise appear to be just another ringing session.

We also have a good relationship with the local press: on several occasions a reporter/photographer has been sent along to the tower to talk to the tower captain and other ringers – coverage in the next edition of the newspaper usually results.

Training

Some very successful and enjoyable training sessions have been held recently.

At the end of May, a Kaleidoscope Ringing Course was run by Elaine Farrow at Billingshurst, taking ringers through various exercises such as place making, to help develop their bell control.

This was followed on 20th June by a Ringing Workshop held at Shipley, run by Graham Hills, focusing on 'Ringing Up and Ringing Down, and doing it in peal'. There were 6 active students, and a couple who wanted to learn but were incapacitated at the time, came to watch.

Angmering & Findon Bellringers – Ringing for VE Day Anniversary - Raymond Bivand Saturday 9 May 2015 - To mark the 70th Anniversary of Victory in Europe (VE Day), the church bells were rung in Angmering and Findon, along with the bells from many other churches in cities, towns and villages across the country.

At 11am the bells rang out over Angmering from St Margaret's church for about half an hour. As well as rounds and call changes, there was some plain hunting followed by Grandsire doubles. The ringers were George Coulson (tower captain), Helen Bickers and Harry, Ken Black, Dave Bowerman, Shirley Hamilton and Raymond Bivand.

Just after 11.30am, we left Angmering for the short journey to Findon where we rang the bells at St John the Baptist church for some 20 minutes. The ringers here were Shirley Hamilton on the treble, Raymond Bivand on the number two bell, Ken Black on number three, David Bowerman on four, Barbara Harbut (tower captain) on five, and George Coulson on the tenor bell. We started off in rounds and then launched into Bob doubles, finishing with some rounds and call changes.

We all enjoyed the ringing and hope that all the people who heard the bells enjoyed them too while thinking about the celebrations 70 years ago.

St Mary's Church, Thakeham – Christine Hounslow

There has been a Church on this site since 1086, and Rectors mentioned from 1208.

In 1724 there were just 4 bells. Three were recast in 1748 and the fourth in 1775. A 5th bell was added in 1809. All were recast in 1925, and in 1948 a new Treble was added, bringing the total to 6 bells.

This year, to commemorate the 70th anniversary of VE Day, all Churches were invited to ring on 9th May, as part of the national celebrations. Thakeham Tower Captain and Band Conductor, Roger Watts, was unable to ring as he was recovering from recent surgery, so the Divisional Education Officer kindly stepped in as Guest Conductor, and the band rang the bells between 10.30am and 11.00am.
