SACAR News and Events

Heritage Open Days: 8th - 11th September 2016

Thousands of buildings and places across England will be throwing their doors open to the public for four days again in September, for an annual celebration of architecture, history and culture. For this year's festival, Heritage Open Days have joined forces with the Central Council of Church Bell Ringers to open up the heritage treasure hidden inside England's bell towers and bring to life the 400-year- old tradition of English-style bell ringing.

The challenge is to open up 500 bell towers across the country to the public, offering special bell ringing demonstrations at some point during the week-end.
