#### **USING ZOOM**

You can download Zoom on to your laptop/computer prior to joining a meeting from their site <a href="www.zoom.us">www.zoom.us</a> but you will be asked to sign up. If you have been sent a hyperlink in a message you can just click on this and it will take you straight to the meeting or waiting room to be admitted if the host has set one up.

Alternatively, if you wish to enter the details in manually go to the website for zoom (as above) and click 'Join Meeting' at the top of the page. If you haven't got zoom already on your computer you will be given the option to download and join/launch the meeting with no need to sign up. You will then be asked for the meeting ID which will have been sent to you. Insert this ID in the box asking for it and click 'Join'; after that you will probably be asked to 'launch meeting' so click this and then enter the passcode which will also have been sent to you. If a waiting room has been set up you will have to wait to be let into the meeting.

All you need on your computer is audio but ideally a speaker & microphone is best, which most laptops have, so you can hear and speak to everyone. A camera, if available, also gives you the option to be seen by clicking 'start the video' from the left-hand corner of the zoom screen. If you wish to have a dummy run let me know and we can have a trial one to one session.


## **THINGUMMY**

This is essentially the pieces of Plain Bob Doubles, but you only ring one element at a time so it is a useful steppingstone to Bob Doubles.

The treble does 4 blows in 5ths to stop the method turning into Plain Bob.

The second just hunts to 4ths, leads and then makes 2nds.

Notice that you get two "goes" at your piece of work before it comes round.



#### Treble

This plain hunts twice BUT stays in 5ths place for 4 pulls (this is called LONG FIFTHS and is part of Plain Bob.

#### <u>Two</u>

Plain hunts, but only up to FOURTHS place (two pulls in fourths place). Useful because this is called MAKING THE BOB in a touch of Plain Bob.

#### <u>Three</u>

Starts with plain hunt up to 5ths place then down to lead.

After leading, it goes UP to 4ths place ....

..then back down to 3rds place for one pull ..

... and carries on back UP to 5ths place (plain hunting)

This is the 3,4 UP DODGE.

#### Four

Starts with plain hunt down to lead then up to 5ths place

It then hunts DOWN to 3rds place ....

..then back up to 4ths place for one pull ..

... and carries on back DOWN to lead (plain hunting)

This is the 3,4 DOWN DODGE.

#### <u>Five</u>

Like the treble, this plain hunts BUT makes LONG 5ths

# CCCBR UPDATE OCTOBER 2020

Recently there have been a number of major pieces of work being undertaken by the Central Council.

## **Gender Imbalance in Ringing**

#### please contribute your experiences

The Central Council has sponsored a research project into the question: Why is it that there is an even gender balance among ringers in the early stages of ringing, but the gender distribution changes at more "advanced levels"? A new working party is looking at this question, so that we can better understand why – although around 50% of new learners are female – there are so few women conductors, few women in senior leadership roles (e.g. ringing masters), fewer female peal-ringers, etc.

## Findon Bells Update

We have had an interesting time exploring the dynamics of the six bells at Findon. Two of these, the 3 and the 5, had been particularly challenging to ring up for many years and would often be up wrong. The 3, unless rung by a more experienced ringer, would invariably be up wrong.

Early investigation, reported in Sally Forth Aug/Sep 2018, hoped to find a simple answer for the difficult 3. The balance of the bell/headstock combination in relation to the swing of the clapper was the issue. We arrived at the suggestion that increasing the weight of the clapper might solve the problem.

All our bells were examined as part of a maintenance programme. The headstocks of the 3 and 5 were older than the more modern headstocks on the other bells, and top-heavy; replacement was advised.

Installation of new headstocks and clapper assemblies and overall refurbishment was carried out in November 2019. The outcome is that all bells go easily and the 3 and 5 can be rung up right every time (Sally Forth Apr/May 2020).




Figure 1 Clapper/bell ratio (see text)

How do these two bells perform now compared with previous findings? Both bells swing quicker; the time for the 3 has fallen by nearly 6% and the time for the 5 by nearly 1%. The clapper/bell ratio, that is the time for the swing of the clapper as a percentage of the time for the swing of the bell, is shown in Fig. 1. The 3 is now close to the recognised limits for ease of ringing up (ref. 1). The ratio for the 5 is within these limits. The previous measurements are shown with a hatched ring.




Figure 2 (after King, McClenahan, Threlfall)

As well as being faster, the 'throw', i.e. the distance between the axes of rotation of the bell and clapper, has changed in both bells. For the 3, this measurement has been reduced from 13.0 to 11.4 cm, and for the 5, the reduction is from 16.5 to 11.5 cm. New calculations have been added to the chart previously published in Sally Forth, Fig. 2 (ref. 2). The eagle-eyed may notice a small correction to one of the points. This shows the overall effect which is to move both bells towards the centre of the cluster, representing easier ringing.
