# Covid guidance, England from the Central Council of Church Bell Ringers

On 19 July, the ringing guidance changed to such a degree that ringing went back to as close to normal as have been since the start of the pandemic. That guidance, agreed with the House of Bishops Recovery Group, can be found <u>here</u>. Whilst the restrictions have largely been released, the Government is stressing personal responsibility, and their guidance contains some very specific considerations around the use of facemasks and the importance of ventilation in towers. There are no longer restrictions on how long you ring for, or with how many other people.
